



PAUL ALLEN TAYLOR

Artist statement:

I have been working in watercolor for nearly thirty years. In the beginning, I painted as a hobby after finishing college classes. With time my skills improved and my range of subjects grew. I soon realized that painting was not just something to do, but something I needed to do. Today I am an artist fulfilling a personal drive as well as benefitting from the sales of my art and teaching others what I have learned.

My recent work has involved pre-drawing in ink with a matchstick. Where some artists will draw over a watercolor in pen and ink, the pre-ink method with a matchstick creates a drawing with varied line as the basis for the painting. This drawing not only adds necessary detail and shape definition to the work but also makes the painting process easier. This pre-ink method will be the subject of my demonstration in November for NFWS.
