

Eileen Sudzina, of Elizabeth Township, PA, has painted since youth, through college, a career, and raising a son. Now retired from the medical field and living the dream of being a fulltime artist, a passion. Eileen loves having received a second degree in commercial art and design and having been mentored by exceptionally talented and world-renowned instructors at Springmaid Beach Watercolor Workshops for the past 15 years. **Artist's Statement**: I am a texturalist and impressionist of realism. By blending my love for painting and photography of the outdoors I see the world with a fractured abstract blend of reality and design.... I paint on YUPO paper, a waterproof nonporous durable synthetic polypropylene plastic film. I like it because it's unique/versatile and allows the use of watercolor painting in a nontraditional manner. The colors are more vibrant on YUPO, as vivid as they are when still wet. The smooth surface of YUPO helps create playful interactions with the colors of paint and magic happens. It is easy to lift the paint and make changes with new techniques, design, line and color which makes it an ideal paper to learn to paint. It allows for total tightness to total looseness. It is a good paper for all subjects. Check out her work at http://eileensudzina-art.com.

- Watercolor pencils, a different option for those people who prefer to draw.
- Pans/pods of watercolor. Participants are usually presented with three colors to use. This enables sharing of colors without overwhelming the participants.
- Magazines they can use to stimulate ideas and as examples for projects.

So start now to set aside needed items. See you all soon.
