Ona Kingdon from Richmond Hill, Ontario is a Signature Member of NFWS. She will show us how she achieves smooth graduations in color through glazing and uses our brain's ability to fill in missing information for effect in watercolor. Watch step by step how she creates a simple high key painting using these techniques. The last year has been a great one for Ona, including prize-winning submissions to the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour, the California Watercolor Association, and the International Watercolor Society's 30th National Exhibition. She has been selected for Splash 16 and 15, and she and her work were the feature article in the *Art of Watercolour Magazine* Issue 12.

Ona shares the following:

"I love to focus on the feeling or emotion when creating art and enjoy painting or drawing any subject matter that has an emotive element to it. I use transparent watercolor to build shape, form and create atmosphere. Color palette is very important to me in helping to create this 'soul' in a painting. I enjoy the subtleties of glazing to build shape and form and develop the colors I feel best convey the atmosphere I am after.

I specialize in portraiture of people and animals but also enjoy painting landscapes, still life and more creative pieces. I have had my work juried into regional, national and international exhibitions and won several awards."
