Risk Being Sorry
Susan Webb Tregay

Susan Webb Tregay is an award-winning signature member of NWS, TWSA, the Watercolor USA Honor Society, as well as the author of *Master Disaster, Five Ways to Rescue Desperate Watercolors* [North Light, 2007, book and DVD]. Susan says on developing your own style:

One lesson that I learned from taking a NFWS workshop years ago has structured my art ever since. I was responsible for escorting the instructor, Marilyn Hughey Phyllis, around to the Albright and other galleries. After a long day of teaching she would stand in front of a single painting for 5 minutes before moving on to the next. Exhausted, I finally asked her what she was looking for in these paintings, and she said "three things." 1. What challenge did the artist set for herself? 2. Did she meet that challenge? And 3. How can I use that challenge to

With my lecture and demo, I will show you how I weeded through dozens of influences in order to find the ones that resonated with me, and then applied them to my acrylic (horrors!) paintings.

improve my own work?

The question then became, how to turn the screw one more time and take my acrylic style and use it with my two other passions, watercolor and plein air painting. My demo will show you what I have come up with so far, as well as some tricks that I depend on every day and hope you will love too.
