lain Stewart is an award winning watercolor artist and a signature member of the American and National Watercolor Societies, and in other state and international societies. His work has received numerous awards in international competitions. Iain's paintings have been published in Southern Living, Cottage Living, Better Homes and Gardens, The Robb Report, Watercolor Artist Magazine, Splash 15, 16, 17, and the French publication Pratique des Arts.

lain maintains a studio in Opelika, Alabama, and in addition to working as a fine artist and workshop instructor, he is an architectural illustrator with an international clientele. He is also an Adjunct Professor at the School of Architecture Auburn University. Iain's teaching process employs a repeatable process involving carefully planned out steps for painting any subject. His method entails making exploratory sketches and value studies to guide the painting process. According to Iain, there is no other tool at your disposal, other than your sketchbook, better suited for exploring ideas with abandon and a carefree attitude. ### Dear NFWS friends:

I grew up with the mantra, "If some is good, more is better." After watching Drayton Jones at our September demonstration, my new mantra is, "If one stroke is good, stop!" Wow. What an amazing painter. He came with several sketches of the Buffalo waterfront, including one blocking out the darks (black) and lights. He also had made small and quarter sheets color studies of the scene he intended to paint, worked in a bunch of people in the fore and backgrounds, a battleship, a skyline of building tops, pennants flying, board walk, etc. Mind you, this was all preparatory to the actual painting that he did for us.

As he started the "real" painting (I would have been delighted with any of the studies), he sketched in the main elements (ship, docks, people, etc.) with a neutral battleship gray. (Yep). He then painted merrily right over his sketch, not caring if it showed through his blocks of color, simply laid on, staying within his outlines but covering others. He made simple strokes with flat brushes, never going over them, using gesture to announce curves and dimensions. He popped in some colorful blobs where the people were, seemingly too-small shapes for heads, and way too-long shapes for legs.

On his second round, he painted more efficientlyplaced, simplified weird shapes that emerged as ship's super-structure, railings, anchor and entry ramps, seemingly random strokes that turned the blobs into people in colorful clothing having a fine time at harbor side. The last round was a bunch of (again seemingly random) calligraphic strokes with a rigger that produced portholes, windows in buildings, telling details, never too many, a wellobserved, beaut-ifully composed representation of our very own waterfront. I'm humbled. Hope you were there! What a start to the year!
