Artist Statement. I was born and raised in Buffalo and attended Bennett HS. I then went to the American Academy of Art in Chicago and the University of Buffalo where I received a degree in Art Education. I taught art for 32 years in the Buffalo Public School system, at both the elementary and the high school level, teaching a full range of art media.

I have been fortunate to do what I love in my career - teach art and share my knowledge and excitement with my students. Now retired, I get to make art everyday. My paintings and drawings derive from life experiences. It is often in mundane images and objects that I find beauty. New places, the personality of an individual, or the uniqueness of a culture also inspire me. I work plein air when I can as the effect of light on shapes in nature has always intrigued me but when I can't work directly on site, I use my drawings and photos as reference in my studio. I love the intense color of pastel, the lusciousness and luster of oil, and the sound and marks of drawing with pencil. However, my very first love is watercolor as I am fascinated to watch the colors mix, blend, and pool, creating edges and blossoms.

The Demonstration. Sandy will be painting Roosters on **Yupo**, a tree-free synthetic paper that's waterproof. Being water-resistant, **Yupo** doesn't absorb the paint as ordinary **watercolor paper** would, creating interesting textures and blossoms that form spontaneously as the paint dries.

You are all precious to me, and I now certainly appreciate the effort you all make to attend meetings, especially those who use walkers and canes.

I was so aggrieved not to be in attendance at **Carol Molnar's** January demonstration. I have always loved Carol's quirky take on life and the wry sense of humor that she sneaks into her work. **Sue Liddell**, a new member of the Waterbucket staff, was kind enough to review her demo:

NFWS members were treated to a delightful evening with Signature member Carol Molnar's January 2020 demonstration. Carol shared her sense of humor, love of painting to music, and many interesting tips. She began by highly recommending a favorite short animated film, Why Man Creates, available at no charge online. Carol demonstrated Brusho crystals, a water based powder of brilliant, transparent colors which lend themselves to loose impressionistic work. Carol also used frisket for masking (similar to contact paper) rather than masking fluid. Another useful tip was the process of cutting out (many) of the same object, in this case a man's shirt, in different colored papers. She then laid them on top of her painting in the area to be painted, to get a sense of what color would work best. Carol also stressed the use of the Elements and Principles of Art and focused on movement and composition. In her demo, she showed how it was sometimes necessary to move things around to create a good composition. By Sue Liddell
