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I have always been intrigued by watercolor as an art form, and how it captures light unlike any other medium. For a number of years, my focus had been on digital art, but in 2013, I began experimenting with watercolor painting, and since then have primarily focused on watercolor.

My subjects are primarily based on the places I have visited in the Midwest and throughout the United States. My training as an architect leads me towards painting architectural subjects, but I find varied subjects in the world around me interesting. In my travels, I find the rural landscapes, small town and city structures both monumental and decaying, and the industrial areas of the rivers to be compelling. I complete paintings both en plein air and in my studio. I usually begin with a small pencil value sketch to determine composition and values prior to painting. When traveling, I like to draw or paint sketches, and always keep a sketchbook with me for pencil and watercolor sketching. I also use the sketchbook for studies in the studio to work on technique and composition. My works are predominantly watercolor on 140# rough watercolor paper. My intention is not to create a photo realistic image of a scene, but to capture the feeling of the scene.

June Guest Artist **Andrew Pitt** of East Anglia, Suffolk, UK, treated us to a wonderful overview of his artistic philosophy and skills. Among his many pieces of advice: have a vision of your finished painting before you begin; use your drawing for shapes and composition, not details; hold the brush at its end to paint loosely; use a variety of edges,

lost and hard; use paint right out of the tube for good strong saturation; make direct statements with every stroke rather than working in layers; don't overdue positive shapes.

Andrew is a direct painter who analyzes his subject matter for importance, position, and color and sets about making bold, strong marks with his brush that create shape and value with economical strokes. He completes section by section (or object by object) so that each element fits into his predetermined vision. Remarkable mastery of the medium and an inspiration!
