William "Skip" Lawrence is an artist and a teacher who has spent his life pursuing what he lovesart. As a nationally recognized painter, author, and teacher, Skip Lawrence is renowned for his extraordinary work as a colorist. He juries national and international exhibitions and regularly has his work included in books, magazines and national publications. When Skip is not busy teaching or painting, he is working on other projects such as The Palette Magazine which he and colleague Christopher Schenk publish together. Skip has also made a variety of instructional videos and has written a book titled Painting Light and Shadow in Watercolor.

Skip says: "I love everything about painting. I love feeling the paint, seeing a rich color spread under my brush onto a surface and the play between colors coming together. I love watching my idea take form until a painting finally says "it" and I am surprised and delighted every time. I love sharing my art and knowing that someone is moved by it. I see no hierarchy among realism, abstraction, non-objective painting styles. I see only the relationship of colors, shapes, surface and line that either thrills or bores me.
